General Studies to General Studies Program

Admission:

ECA Students enrolled in the Associate of Arts in General Studies at CC who wish to articulate to the General Education Program at MU must complete the Millersville University admission process, including but not limited to: Millersville University admissions application, application fee, and submission of all official transcripts from secondary and post-secondary institutions.

Millersville University will review each student for admission according to first-year freshman student admission criteria. This includes review the student's high school GPA, test scores1 and work completed at Cecil College.

- Applicants Must earn grades of "C" or higher to transfer courses from Cecil College to Millersville University
- Prior to matriculation to Millersville University, the student will have successfully completed the Associate of Arts in General Studies at CC and will have forwarded final, official transcripts indicating the award of Associate of Arts in General Studies at CC to Millersville University.

ECA students who successfully complete the Associate of Arts in General Studies at CC and the courses outlined in Appendix A and accepted to MU, will enter as a freshman and are assured transfer credit as indicated. Courses in degree programs not included in Appendix A will be evaluated by MU on a. course-by-course basis.
