



Cecil College to Neumann University

Articulation Agreements for Traditional Undergraduate Programs

Admissions:

- Cecil College students who are admitted to either an Associate in Arts (AA), Associate in Science (AS), Associate in Fine Arts (AFA), or an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree program are eligible to participate in this agreement and upon graduation from Cecil College, be admitted to a specified undergraduate degree program at Neumann University, provided they:
 - Complete an Articulation/Intent to Enroll form as soon as possible, but no later than successful completion of 45 transferable college-level credits.
 - Submit a completed Neumann Application for Admission, ideally once 45 credits have been earned at Cecil College or at least three to six months prior to the start of the semester in which they plan to begin their studies at Neumann.
 - Participants from Cecil College must:
 - Graduate from Cecil College with either an AA, AFA, AS, AAS or AAT degree with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0;
 - Enroll at Neumann University within one year of graduating from Cecil College and do not attend another institution between graduation and attendance at Neumann;
 - Satisfy all other Neumann University general admissions and program specific admission requirements, as well as the University's residency requirement.
 - Students who have previously been matriculated at Neumann University are only permitted to apply for this Articulation Program if approval is granted by both Cecil College Advising & Transfer Office and Neumann University's Director of Admissions;
 - Submit official college/university and high school transcripts to Neumann University.
 - Nursing major – Students must have all required official documents submitted to the Neumann University Admissions Office by October 15th, one year prior to enrollment for students wishing to enter in the fall. Students wishing to start in the spring, must have documents submitted by April 15th, one year prior to spring enrollment. The University also requires:
 - A minimum grade of "C" for all transferred courses;
 - A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.7;
 - A minimum cumulative science grade point average of 3.0, the first time a grade is earned in college-level courses in Anatomy & Physiology I, Anatomy & Physiology II, Microbiology, and Chemistry 103 & 104 with lab;
 - Cecil College students will need to complete Statistics upon acceptance into Neumann if they have not taken it within 7 years;
 - All sciences courses and Nutrition will be taken within 7 years of application to the Nursing major.
 - For students from a non-English speaking country and for whom English is a second language, the Nursing program required an Internet-based TOEFL with a minimum overall score of 84 and a minimum score of 26 on the verbal subtest; the MELAB requires a minimum overall score of 81 with a speaking score of 3; or the Duolingo English Test (DET) with a minimum overall score of 110 are all accepted.
- *Any students who do not hold a current RN license or who hold a RN license but are not currently practicing as a professional nurse must meet all requirements described above.

Applicable Programs:

The following program are open to those Cecil College students who opt to participate in this Articulation Agreement. Unless otherwise indicated, acceptance to any of these programs requires a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0. All programs are only available during the day unless indicated otherwise.
