



# **Cecil College and Washington College**

# English AA to English BA

#### **Admissions:**

- 1. Students who have graduated from Cecil College with a completed associate's degree in English may apply for admission to Washington College. Once a completed application is received, and with confirmation of a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher, students will be granted admission to Washington College as an English major.
- 2. Students who are currently enrolled in their final semester of coursework at Cecil College are encouraged to apply for admission to Washington College prior to completion of their associate's degree. Upon acceptance and receipt of the enrollment deposit, students will be assigned an advisor for enrollment in classes with their cohort. Admission to Washington College is contingent upon successful completion of the Cecil College English associate's degree with a 2.0 cumulative grade point average or higher.
- All articulated course credits applied towards the Cecil College associate's degree in English must be a Cor better to be accepted for transfer, according to the transfer equivalencies delineated in the
  appendices.

## Appendix 1:

#### Cecil College English AA to Washington College English BA Recommended Curricular Pathway

This curricular pathway describes how to complete the Cecil College Associate of Arts degree in English and fulfill Washington College Bachelor of Arts degree requirements. While it is not mandatory to follow this exact path, the equivalences presented here serve as a useful roadmap to efficiently fulfilling Washington College general education and major requirements while at Cecil College.

Students should seek appropriate advising with regard to (1) completion of requirements for the Cecil College Associate of Arts in English, (2) transfer to Washington College, and (3) completion of requirements for the Washington College Bachelor of Arts in English.

**Advising notes**: 1) In completion of the Cecil General Education requirements in science, transfer students should take both of their science courses with a lab, or plan to take another science with lab at Washington College. 2) Cecil College students are encouraged to take Spanish 101 and, 102 or Russian 101 and 102 as general education electives while at Cecil College. 3) Cecil College students are encouraged to choose at least one fine art general education course from Appendix 2, especially the approved courses in ART, MUC, or THE. 4) Transfer students are allowed to graduate with 126 credits, though most students reach 128 credits.
