Enrollment for the 2024-2025 School Year



The following are instructions to help you complete the application:

- 1. Read the instructions carefully.
- 2. **Students** should complete the application in <u>black or blue ink.</u>

Step 1- Applying

Submit the following documents by June 3, 2024 to the Director of Early College. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

- □ Completed Early College Academy College Bound Scholarship Eligibility Form
- ☐ Middle School Transcript
- □ Early College Academy student questionnaire
- □ Parent and child acknowledgement of expectations.

Step 2- Selection Process

Admission into the Early College Academy will be based on the following factors:

- o Minimum of 3.0 unweighted grade point average
- Successful completion of Algebra I (or higher) in mathematics
- Completed middle school transcript
- o Review of student questionnaire

Note: No preference will be given for early applications. Applications will only be reviewed for completeness prior to the June 3, 2024 application deadline. All applications for acceptance will be evaluated at the same time.

Step 3- Confirmation of Acceptance

After applications are reviewed, students accepted into the ECA will receive an email of acceptance. Upon receipt of that email, students must:

- Send an email confirming acceptance into the Academy. All emails must to be sent to: April Stern, Director of Early College at Cecil College at <u>astern@cecil.edu</u>
- Complete the Cecil College Admissions application specific to Early College Academy students.
 Directions will be provided after acceptance into the program.

Step 4- Fall Orientation

Accepted students will attend the mandatory orientation night at Oxford Area High School in August 2024. ECA schedules will be provided the night of orientation.

Quick Facts

Early College Academy Description

The Early College Academy, co-located at Cecil College and Oxford Area High School, will enroll students beginning in grade 9. Successful students will complete high school with a high school diploma and an Associate's degree from Cecil College. Each year up to 25 students are selected for admission to the Academy. Prior to their freshman year, Academy students will participate in an Orientation Program to introduce them to academic expectations and resources available to them during their four years in the Academy. Throughout their enrollment, students are supported by tutors, mentors, and advisors from Oxford and Cecil College. While taking classes, students are guided through seminars and individualized advising to help them build the academic skills needed to succeed in high school and college coursework.

Admission Process

Each eighth-grade student entering the Early College Academy must complete the admissions process by **June 3rd**. They will submit application materials to the Early College Academy Director or to the middle school guidance counselor. Application materials are reviewed and evaluated by administrators of Cecil College. Students are contacted by mid-June to confirm their admission to the Academy.

- A transcript with a minimum GPA of 3.0
- College bound scholarship eligibility form
- Student questionnaire

- Parent & child acknowledgement of expectations
- Successful completion of Algebra I

Support Services

Academic support will be provided throughout each year of enrollment. Support services will be highlighted at orientation, so students and their families are sufficiently aware of the resources available to help them succeed. Students will have access to tutoring, library resources, a reading and writing center, and computer labs. Academy students will be guided through their coursework with the support of an academic advisor and academic seminars. A sampling of the seminars is as follows:

- Test Taking Techniques
- Time Management
- Study Skills & Strategies
- Math Building Skills
- Critical Thinking Skills
