GRADUATED WITH HONORS

HIGHEST HONORS

A graduate in a degree program completing at least 30 semester hours at Cecil College and a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher will graduate "with Highest Honors" as signified by the wearing of a purple tassel.

HONORS

A graduate in a degree program completing at least 30 semester hours at Cecil College and a cumulative GPA of 3.50 to 3.74 will graduate "with Honors" as signified by the wearing of a red tassel.

DISTINCTION

A graduate in a certificate program completing at least 15 credits at Cecil College and a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or higher will graduate "with Distinction" as signified by the wearing of a blue tassel.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The traditional black caps and gowns worn in the academic procession have been the costume of scholars since medieval times when students and teachers wore long gowns and hoods for protection against the cold of unheated buildings. For faculty regalia, the most colorful and distinctive part of the academic costume is the hood which passes around the neck and extends down the back. The color of the velvet edging indicates the wearer's field of study. The colors of the silk lining exposed in the center of the hood are those of the college or university that conferred the degree. The cap, or mortarboard, is the most popular design for all degrees. The tassel may be black or the color of the field of study. A soft tam may be worn by the person with a doctorate degree. The tassel of the doctorate's cap may be gold.

The stoles are worn by the Early College Academy (ECA) and Alpha Alpha Theta (AAT) Chapter Members. In addition, AAT Chapter Members are denoted by the wearing of a cord, stole and tassel.

HISTORY OF CECIL COLLEGE

Cecil College was founded in 1968 to meet the postsecondary and continuing education needs of Cecil County residents. The College is governed by a Board of Trustees appointed by the governor. The College's president, Dr. Mary Way Bolt, is the fifth president of the College.

Cecil College is a small, publicly funded, open-access institution that promotes educational, cultural, and economic development in an ever-evolving county in rural, northeastern Maryland. The faculty and staff are dedicated to providing an optimal education in an environment that fosters social responsibility and appreciation for cultural diversity. Cecil College offers high-quality associate degrees, certificates, and transfer opportunities as well as career and continuing education courses and programs. These options are designed to help students prepare for a career or additional education, acquire and upgrade their employment skills, or expand their horizons with personal enrichment classes. A variety of support services are available to help students formulate and achieve their goals.

On June 13, 2007, the Maryland Higher Education Commission voted unanimously to accept Cecil Community College's Board of Trustees petition to change its name to Cecil College. The change became effective July 1, 2007.
